RULES

1. All exhibits should be in the field by 10.30a.m. on show morning. Two people allowed in to field with each horse and cattle exhibit only.
2. The Judges may withhold a prize in any class or competition, where in their opinion, sufficient merit does not exist.
3. **The decision of the Judges shall be final in all classes and there shall be no appeal there from. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated.**
4. **The committee reserve the right to refuse entries, vary prize list or arrangement and shall not be liable for any claim for compensation or otherwise arising out of the holding, abandonment, alteration or amalgamation of any classes, date of show, or for any claim arising out of or connected with the show.**
5. Although every reasonable precaution will be taken to ensure the safety and welfare of the animals and all other exhibits, the Committee will not be responsible for loss or accident of any kind that may occur. Neither will the committee be accountable for any accident that may occur to any person attending the event either on the field or on the approaches thereto, and whether such person or persons are visitors, exhibitors or otherwise.
6. All first prize-winners debarred from competing in subsequent classes except for championship and special awards. Ponies and children's calf classes are exempt from this rule.
7. All cattle to be exhibited must have passed a TB test according to the present Department of Agriculture rules. All animals must come from herds which are not restricted. Certificates of Compliance for each animal must be produced. **See Cattle Section for full details.**
8. The committee shall have the power to disqualify from competition.
9. Right of admission strictly reserved to all classes and competitions.
10. Any objection to any prize-winner in any class or competition must be lodged in writing with the Hon-Secretary within the hour of judging of the event, together with a fee of €50, which will be forfeited in the event of the objection being over-ruled.
11. **All animals must be suitably haltered, restrained and trained and all horse, pony and cattle exhibitors must have Public Liability Insurance to cover any eventuality.**
12. Rules for qualifiers are available on request and competitors are bound by the same.
13. No child under 16 years of age on day of show may lead an animal other than Calf Classes 1, 2, 32, 51 and Pony Class 44. The stewards have the authority to determine if a person is capable of leading an animal in any class.
14. Barryroe Show Ltd. is a Member of the I.S.A. and Affiliated to I.P.S.
15. **NO STALLIONS ALLOWED.**
17. **NO PRIZE FUNDS WILL BE ISSUED ON SHOW DAY. PRIZE FUNDS WILL BE ISSUED BY CHEQUE 10 DAYS AFTER SHOW DAY**
18. **NEW: If a qualified exhibitor does not turn up to an ISA final without giving prior notice to the ISA office or to a board member he or she will incur a financial penalty.**

Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine Notice

Specific requirements Horses and other Equines.

Premises Registration - As from 1 May 2012, any premises (**which include shows, fairs and markets**) where horses or other equines are gathered must be registered with the Department. Owners/persons in charge of such gatherings are required to submit a completed application for registration and keep records of movements on/off the premises.

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the department for the purposes of tracing disease.

Records required are:

- The name and address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.
- Premises registration number from which the equine came a
- Passport Number/UEL number of the Animal.

It is important therefore that show organisers should contact their local District Veterinary Office in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined above.

**Important Information for Exhibitors of Cattle
Regarding Movement of Bovine to Shows 2026
Issued by the Department of Agriculture and Food**

The Department of Agriculture implemented a number of changes on 4th February 2019 which changed the procedures and criteria applicable when applying for a Certificate of Compliance for the movement of cattle. These also impact on the certificate which is required when moving bovine to a Show. The following sets out the criteria applicable: The movement of cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on the Animal Identification and Movement System (AIM).

In line with these changes a specific certificate of Compliance for the ***“Movement of Bovine from a Single Holding to a Show”*** must now be requested prior to the movement of animals concerned.

These Certificates can be created by (i) applying online using their agfood account or (ii) where the keeper is not online the certificate can be generated by the local Regional Veterinary Office following receipt of a NBAS31K with issue of the certificate being subject to normal criteria applicable. This form will be available on the Department’s Website and will also be included with the Show Circular when issued.

When applying for this certificate the destination herd/ or Show number is not required. The certificate generated will include an “S” symbol.

The Certificate of Compliance for a Show will continue to be valid for a period of up to 28 days. As is currently the case these can be used for the movement of animals to a number of shows during the validity period of the certificate.

Please note – Calves which are less than 10 days cannot be moved to a Show.

As is currently the case the Movement Notification Section of the Certificate should be completed by the Keeper and the Show Officer who must clearly indicate the Show Number. The Show movement should be recorded on the passport. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling these requirements lies with the Show Officer. If the animals move to a herd other than the source herd, the new destination herd must complete and sign the certificate also.

Department of Agriculture, Food and The Marine Certificate of Compliance requirements on the day of the show, the Certificate of Compliance should be presented to the Show Officer. The keeper and the show officer will then sign the Movement Notification section of the Certificate will then be sent to the local RVO for recording onto the AIM system.

All Cattle must bear double plastic tags as issued under the Department’s identification system. They must be accompanied by their passport
